A native of Corinth, Mrs. Dyson taught school in Alcorn County for 30 years. She was teaching in Gary at the time of her death. She was a graduate of the University of Mississippi and a Baptist.

The body is being returned to Corinth by Perkins Funeral Home, and will remain at the Perkins Chapel until time for the funeral. Services will be held the North Corinth Baptist Church, with burial in Presbyterian Shiloh Cemetery. Other arrangements are incomplete.
