## **Indian Springs Methodist Church**

In about 1895, the Indian Springs Methodist Church came from the church at Pleasant Ridge near Strickland. Indian Springs' first church was built just south of the I. C. Railroad on the Jacinto Road. The Reynold brothers donated the land for the church.

In 1911, the church was destroyed by a storm. Napoleon Wilson donated land for another church building, and it was constructed two miles north of the first structure.

On April 20, 1920, another storm blew the second church facility down. It was built back, and in 1929, it was moved to old 72 Highway North. This land was given to the church by George Dowd. The trustees in 1929 were J. M. Lowery, Jim Sitton, and A. D. Joslin. The pastor was W. T. Bazzel.

In the early spring of 1961, the 32 members began plans for a new building. At the same time, another acre of land was purchased to start a cemetery.

On Sunday, November 19, 1961, the first service was held in the new building. The church had its dedication service on November 24, 1963.
