 Q. What was the date of his enlistment? Answer May 7 - 1862
 Q. What was the name of the company and regiment or vessel in which he enlisted? Answer Ed Partus Co. v. Balintus Regt
 Q. How long was he in actual service of the Confederacy? Answer 17 months & 6 days
 Q. What were the names of the officers of the company, or regiment or vessel during the time he was in the service? Answer Ed Partus Capt Balintus Regiment of Cavalry
 Q. Did he die in service, or did he serve till close of the war? Answer after war was over he died at Home
 Q. Was he honorably discharged? Answer No Q. When was he discharged? Answer Oct 15, 1863
 Q. Where was he discharged? Answer Brownsville Miss Q. Did he serve until the surrender? Answer No
 Q. Where did he die? Answer Tate Co Miss Q. When did he die? Answer July 10, 1891
 Q. What is your age? Answer 50 years Q. Have you married since your husband's death? Answer I have not
 Q. Do you apply for a pension because you are indigent and unable to earn a livelihood? Answer I do, 10 Daughters to support
 Q. Do you hold any State, United States, County or City office, or have you employment from which you are receiving, as salary or fees, the sum of three hundred dollars per annum? Answer I do not
