Application of Indigent Widow of Soldier or Sailor of the Late Confederacy, under Chapter 102, Code of 1906, as amended by Laws of April 5th, 1910, Chapter 207, and Laws of March 24th, 1916, Chapter 199.

Applications must be filed in duplicate with the Chancery Clerk on or before the first Monday in September of year in which application is first made, and no application will be entertained not on printed form.
