In this room which has so often responded to his voice, his memory will long be cherished. Even when those of us who now minister around his alter of justice shall likewise have passaway; the recollection of his merits and his excellency will still be preserved.

As a feeble testimonial of the regard in which we held the man, I move the adoption of the following resolutions.
