## **CHILDERS**, James

Died 1862\*

[Re-interred at Lindsey Cemetery, Dennis, Mississippi]

**SMITH**, Madison W.

Died September 1862\*

[Re-interred at New Hope Cemetery, Ripley, Mississippi]

\* These soldiers were killed during the Civil War in a skirmish near Paden, Mississippi. The soldiers were supposedly from Ripley, Mississippi; they were serving as part of a detachment under Col. Faulkner. In later years, the graves were moved to different cemeteries. This information was obtained from Mr. Billy Paden.
