(This Key to the diary was written by Caleb F. Darden, son of Thomas L. Darden, Jr. and Maggie McGinty).

Children of the writer of the Diary:

John Buckner Darden; lived at Milliken's Bend, Louisiana, died in the Confederate States Army.

Martha married Dr. Patrick Henry "Pat" Wade.

Olivia married Dr. Uriah Overton Tate; lived near Natchez.

Laura married (1) Winfield Bridewell; m. (2) Edward Short.

Irene married Dr. Thomas Gage "Tommie"West - killed by negroes (Ku Klux Klan raid).

Jesse Blount Darden married Sallie Killingsworth.

George Young Darden married Rosa M. Jones.

Brothers and sisters of Jesse Harper Darden - husband of the writer of the diary:

"Betsy" (Elizabeth) called "Sister Betsy" married (1) Samuel Hornsby and (2) Benjamin F. Sibley; lived near Natchez. Samuel W. SpringHill, an early settlement between Fayette and Stampley.

Wildwood Springs, a pleasure resort owned by my great-grandfather, John Pendleton Darden, also miles. Am not sure but think it was SW of Fayette, probably Adams-Franklin Co.

The residence of John P. Darden and wife, called "Coz John and Coz. Margaret" in diary, was built by Susan Sillers Darden's father, Walter Sillers. Family graveyard near.

Torrey graveyard E of Fayette (Scotch Settlement). Also buried here Rev. William Montgomery, Buckner Darden. Near by the Buckles - McPhersons and Currie or Curry graveyards. Closer to Fayette on Union Church road is private cemetery of Prosper King "P. K." Montgomery.
