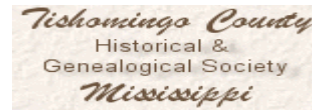

BURCHAM GRAVES

The Burcham gravesite was surveyed by Hassell Holder on August 5, 1996, for the Tishomingo County Historical & Genealogical Society (TCHGS). The following burial information was transcribed from TCHGS' book entitled *Tishomingo County Mississippi Cemeteries* by Helah Wilson and Janice Switcher on November 3, 2005.

Driving Directions: Travel Highway 365 South from Burnsville, Mississippi, to the Holts Spur community. Turn west onto the first road north of the railroad bridge on Highway 365. Drive past the brick house and continue on to the wooden framed house. Walk behind this house to a pond levee in the hollow. The graves are at the far end of the pond levee. The property is owned by Ray Davis's daughter.
