According to notes from the previous cemetery survey in 1996, there are other Carpenter burials in this cemetery. Approximately 25 unreadable and/or unmarked graves were noted during the 1996 survey. Overgrowth of weeds and infestation of ticks did not allow the researchers to locate all the unmarked graves during the 2006 survey.
