It is not known when the Hebron Church was founded. At some point in time, the church functioned as an independent Methodist church, but the church closed its doors. From about 2003 to 2005, the Southwest Baptist Church, pastored by Bobby Johnson, met in the Hebron Church facility.

In 2006, a small group of believers rented the building for \$200, cleaned it up, and opened the church doors once again. The first service was held on Sunday, July 23, 2006, with Johnny S. Nunley as the minister. A total of 22 believers were in attendance for the first service. The congregation elected to retain the church's name—Hebron Church. However, this group of believers disbanded by the end of 2006 due to Bro. Johnny Nunley's health.
