Indian Creek-Peel Cemetery Tishomingo County, Mississippi

The Indian Creek–Peel Cemetery was surveyed by Shorty Bonds, Leon Johnson, and Judy Walker on October 31, 1996, for the Tishomingo County Historical & Genealogical Society (TCHGS). It was transcribed from TCHGS' cemetery book by Helah Wilson and Janice Switcher on November 27, 2005.

<u>Driving Directions</u>: Take Eastport Road (County Road 956) and drive approximately 2.5 miles to County Road 261. Take County Road 261 approximately 2.5 miles to the intersection of County Road 256. Turn right on County Road 256; go approximately 200 yards up the hill. The cemetery is just off the road on the left in the woods.
