The Modern Woodmen of America had a former camp in Tishomingo County, Mississippi. Camp No. 16134 was chartered on June 3, 1915, at Iuka, and it was known as the Iuka Camp. Deputy Head Consul William R. Grant of New Albany, Mississippi, organized the following 17 men on June 7, 1915. These men were:
