The Spring Hill Methodist Church was organized in 1909. There were 14 charter members: G. C. Stephens, A. W. Millsaps, J. F. Oaks, J. T. Blissit, A. W. Rost, J. E. Harp, and R. A. Belue. Other members included Mrs. M. A. Rutledge, Mrs. Alice Rutledge, Mrs. Ethel Millsaps, Mrs. Lillie Oaks, Mrs. Amie Stephens, Mrs. Melinda Rost, and Mary Blissitt. Mrs. Mary Blissitt is now a member of Tishomingo Methodist Church. The Rev. B. P. Jace was Presiding Elder, and Rev. J. R. James was pastor-in-charge.

The Old Spring Hill School was used as a church meeting place until 1911, when the first church was built. J. T. Blissitt donated the land for the church. The church was a frame building, and was used until the present church was built in 1954.

Spring Hill was transferred to the Tishomingo Charge from Iuka in the fall of 1929, and then returned to the Iuka Charge in 1930. The charge was divided in 1959, and Spring Hill was included on the Iuka South Charge. Presently, the congregation has nearly 80 members.
