Tishomingo Church of Christ, Tishomingo, Mississippi 38873

The Christian Church of Tishomingo had its origin from a tent meeting held on the school grounds by a visiting church member, John T. Smith. Six were baptized, and following the revival meeting, a church was organized in 1914. The first elders of the church were F. F. Belue, W. M. Glasgow, and Luther Owens. The church building was probably constructed in 1914. In 1949, two classrooms and a baptistery were added. In 1950, two more classrooms were constructed. In 1952, a nursery was added, and in 1954, an new entrance and restrooms were added to the facility. The parsonage was built in 1968-69, and other improvements to the church building followed.
