## Twin Magnolias Iuka, Miss.



**1842**—house built as home of John Marshall Stone who served as a Major in the Confederate Army and became Governor of Mississippi in 1876. After the Battle of Iuka, many wounded men were brought to this home, among General Henry Little of Maryland, who died of his wounds in the master bedroom of the former spring house.
