Calvary Baptist Church was organized in 1941 under the name of Ebenezer Baptist Church. The land for the church building was donated by Mr. W. T. Shook. The name of the church was changed to Calvary Baptist Church in February 1956. At that time, it began full-time preaching services and was the second full-time Baptist Church in Tishomingo County, Mississippi.

The existing church building was built in 1961. In 1970, the church purchased adjoining property on the east side of the building to be used for a pastorium. In 1971, there was an addition to it, and at the same time, a complete renovation of the present building was also made.

Throughout the years, the following men have served as pastors: Ernie Neil, O. R. Montgomery, W. G. Beam, Pat Howard, A. M. Nix, A. B. Harris, J. A. Blunt, Dossie Hutchens, and W. A. Hamilton. W. A. Hamilton began serving the church on April 6, 1972. The church had a total of 255 members in 1976.
