The Colored First Baptist Church of Belmont that was located on the present Trentham place on Moore's Mill Road had a finance drive and all day singing with its Tishomingo members on March 13, 1932. W. M. Keller gave the sermon, while topic discussion and singing were held in the afternoon. S. H. Hood was the Belmont pastor. John Ford was church superintendent and Maggie Lou Hood was church secretary. A cemetery was started near the church. In later years, a storm destroyed the church.
